- Develop fieldwork and other geographical skills and techniques.

In our lessons, we enjoy focussing on:

<u>Investigating places</u> – Understanding the geographical location of places and their key features.


<u>Investigating physical and human geography</u> – Understanding the relationships between the physical features of places and the human activity within them, and the appreciation of how the world's natural resources are used.

<u>Communicating Geographically</u> – Understanding geographical representations, vocabulary and techniques.

<u>Sustainability</u> - Understanding that nature and the environment are not an inexhaustible resource and so, it is necessary to protect them and use them rationally showing consideration for future generations.


Michael Palin

Who is Michael Palin?

Michael Palin was a British actor and comedian, as well as a television presenter and writer. He was one of the members of the comedy group 'Monty Python' which is a series that some of your parents might have enjoyed. Michael Palin also has a huge passion for travel.





Early life

Michael Palin was born in Sheffield in the West Riding of Yorkshire, England He started his education at Birkdale Preparatory School, Sheffield, and later attended Shrewsbury School, and graduated from Brasenose College, Oxford with a degree in History.










Michael Palin has a huge passion for travelling.

In 1980, he enjoyed taking part in the BBC Television series 'Great Railway Journeys of the World'. This involved travelling across the UK by train, from London to Kyle of Lochalsh (Scotland), via Manchester, York, Newcastle upon Tyne, Edinburgh and Inverness. This must have been an exciting journey for him.



Passion for travel continued...

In 1989, he was asked to present the first of BBC's travel series 'Around the World in 80 Days'



When he was asked, he said he would think about it and let the producers know in a few days as he felt it might be a challenge. He had a think and called them back much sooner with a YES! It was a great success and was followed by seven other shows in the series. On the next slide, learn a little bit more about where the idea for 'Around the World in 80 Days' came from.

Around the World in 80 Days

The BBC TV series that Michael was asked to do was inspired by the famous Jules Verne story which involved traveling the world in 80 days without using an aircraft.


Who was Jules Verne?

Verne was born on February 8, 1828, in Nantes, France. He studied law and worked for a while as a stockbroker, but he always considered himself to be a writer. His first successful adventure story was *Five Weeks in a Balloon*, which was published in 1863.

Verne's most famous adventure novels were <u>Twenty Thousand Leagues</u> <u>Under the Sea (1870)</u> and <u>Around the World in Eighty Days (1873).</u>

Twenty Thousand Leagues Under the Sea is the story of Captain Nemo, a mysterious wanderer who commands a marvelous submarine. Around the World in Eighty Days is the story of Phileas Fogg, an English man who wanted to prove he could travel around the world in 80 days without an aircraft.


What common theme can you see in the novels written by Jules Verne?
