## **SEN Support**

It is a very different experience teaching children with SEND, than it is parenting; just as it is different to parenting children who are largely 'neurotypical'. We know there are lots of support groups online but having people in the local setting, with the local offers of services and availability, would be extremely useful for parents to have. With national and local services and external support for families dwindling, we would like to facilitate support for families with children who have additional needs; from others who have experienced similar. To do this, we need to ascertain who, within our community, would have the capacity to lend an ear, offer words of wisdom and/or be there for a coffee when things can feel overwhelming. ## Infant Illness

We have seen a significant spike in infant illness and want to let parents know of that actions we are taking to combat this. After half term, we will be doing a big push on handwashing with the children; looking at the spread of germs and how we can prevent it. As we head into Spring, we have decided to turn the heating system off at school to see if this alleviates the spread of bugs - it may be worth investing in some vests for your children.
